Behaviour and Engagement Framework. Key Expectations

On Monday the whole staff headed to St Luke's PS, Shepparton, to attend a professional learning day run by Dan Petro an international behavioural expert. Dan's work is informing our staff on how we can better develop a consistent and effective behaviour and engagement framework for our school.

On Tuesday evening the developments of this framework were shared with the school board and in Term 2 we will have an evening to update parents on where we are at.

I very much appreciate the positive comments from parents around how they acknowledge that the staff is striving to make Holy Rosary a more productive, respectful and safe place by developing strategies for better behaviour and engagement. This builds on the fine work that has been implemented over the past few years while at the same time sets us up for a very positive future.

Our focus this week is on how we line up for class.

The staff have identified expectations that we have for this time each day at our school and will teach this to the children this week in class. The students will also contribute to this list.



RESPECT FOR SELF
RESPECT FOR OTHERS

Lining up (beginning of the day, after recess and after lunch)

Key Expectation - Respect for Self

- Toilet, drink, hands washed
- On time
- Have everything you took out with you, e.g., hat, jumper, drink bottle
- Tidy self up, e.g., removed sand, grass, dirt from clothes and self
- Have a smile on your face.

Key Expectation - Respect for Others

- Standing appropriate distance between one another (one hand span in front and one handspan beside)
- Hands and feet to yourself
- Standing quietly
- Do not move away from the partner you are standing next to
- Stand still

Key Expectation - Respect for Environment

- Be responsible for carrying your own bag
- Make sure your belongings are with you
- YOU carry YOUR bag
- Collect drink bottles/lunch-boxes, hats, etc. from classroom/outdoor areas prior to transition to same
- Collect and pack up any equipment YOU used during break time

Key Expectation - Be Safe

- Hands off
- Respect other people's space
- Walk to the classroom door
- Line up in pairs behind one another
- Have a great day

As we move through the year we will develop expectations for key places and events in our school such as assembly, playground, dismissal, mass, etc.

This week we welcome four new young people to our school as teaching assistants. These four were selected after quite a rigorous interview process after a short listing from a group of ten applicants. The teaching assistants are in our school to assist all students to be successful. They will work with the teachers to ensure students are safe, settled and ready to learn. There will be two new teaching assistants each day in the school as well as Mrs Genene Fisher who will be working in the middle and senior classes. Why is it important that children are given opportunities for a longer turn to talk and listen?


Children's Chatter Matters!

Language Learning activities to have a go at home.

6. Encourage your child to listen to sounds at the *end* of words. Choose two words from their reader/book and ask them to judge if the two words end with the same sound (say some that match and some that do not). Encourage them to say the words too, and feel the sounds at the end of the words. Then, point out the two sounds at the end.



After mastering this, you might then say two words and ask your child which word has a certain sound at the end. For example, "Which word has the 'd' sound at the end: bed or man (bed)".
