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### **'PLUS ONE' TEACHER FOR HOLY ROSARY**

Some of you may have seen two ads in the Bendigo Advertiser on Saturday for Holy Rosary. One is for a Wellbeing Worker to replace Jess Dawson who moved on from Holy Rosary at the end of Term 3. I am sure we will have several excellent applicants for this position.



The other ad is for an Early Career Teacher. This teacher is being sought for our 2017 staff to enable us to develop a 'Plus One' teacher position within our school. There has been much research and evidence that this model of a Plus One teacher assists students to be successful. It allows teaching to continually be the driver of all classroom activity.

- Such a position will be the hero of how we grow our students
- It is an extra teacher in our school who is not aligned to a specific class
- The Plus One teacher will deliver excellent teaching across the school targeted at students and their identified assessment data
- It will be well planned, structured and explicit
- The Plus One teacher will be a consistent voice of excellence across our school
- The role will build capacity of others within the school

Feedback from other schools is that the Plus One has now become an essential part of each school as targeted delivery in Numeracy and Literacy is growing those students who would not be given the extra push due to traditional groupings and perhaps a tendency to focus on the ones who need extra assistance.

Applications for the Early Career Teacher close on Fri 11th, Interviews Monday 14th and the successful applicant will be invited to our staff planning day Wed 16th Nov.

### **CLASS STRUCTURE 2017**



I am enlightened by the energy and professionalism our staff have demonstrated over the past few weeks in determining the best class structure for our students in 2017. They not only have a great understanding of the needs of each child in their class but they genuinely care for all children in the school and are very open to input from colleagues about what is best for their students. The staff have workshoped the best class structure over several staff meetings and determined that going to six classrooms will allow us to have smaller groups and be able to place our children where they are safe and successful. We have now committed to this extra class and will now commit to the Plus One teacher as well.

As Learning and Teaching continues to inform all decisions at our school, I believe this move towards a Plus One teacher will be looked upon in 12 months time as a significant point in our journey towards success for our students.

### **MASTER PLANNING FOR HOLY ROSARY**

Our school numbers are growing. We opened 2016 at 102 students and at this stage we will open 2017 at 111 students. The school was 63 students 4 years ago. It is therefore important that we be proactive with ensuring Holy Rosary can cater for the future.

Therefore we have engaged E-plus architects to facilitate this process and the first meeting was on Tuesday.

We have established a Project Control Group (PCG) with staff, school board reps and E-plus staff who have begun to determine what our school needs to cater for the future. This is the first of many meetings to develop an educational philosophy as well as a plan of how our school looks physically. Others from our wider community will be called on as determined by the group for input and once the process is developing the wider community will be encouraged to have input into our planning.

This is a tremendous opportunity for our school community and one that the staff and school board take very seriously. There has been much invested into this school over many decades by many people from our community and respect and acknowledgment of the past as well as a positive look towards the future will ensure our best outcomes.

**MUCH NEEDED, COVERED OUTDOOR LEARNING AREA (COLA)**

The school Board have been looking into the possibility of erecting a COLA at the school over the basketball courts as well as the relocation of the sports and storage sheds.

With the wet winter/Spring that we have had in 2016 and now with the first elements of what could be a very hot Summer, it really does make sense that we provide solid cover for our students from the elements.

I particularly thank board members Dean Bibby, Helen Naylor and Brice Pianta for the extra meetings and research they have committed to this project. They are a great support to myself and in the big picture to students at our school for years to come.

This project is still at planning stage and Mrs Hamilton and I are working on the funding side of the project this week, however there is a need and we will do all we can to create a solution to the need.

**SCHOOL DISCO**

Last Thursday was another great day where community was strengthened through us all coming together for a celebration event. Our Parents and Friends Committee decorated the O’Dee centre for the Disco beautifully and many of our children attended dressed in the spooky theme. It was a great deal of fun for all involved and raised funds for our school programs.



**VICTORIAN CURRICULUM**

On Monday, Miss Mitchell and I headed to Shepparton to attend a presentation on the new Vic Curriculum that we will be implementing in 2017. Our staff are planning for 2017 next week on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> and we need to be familiar with the adjustments required for the new curriculum before then. We are very lucky to have Miss Mitchell leading the learning at Holy Rosary as when I attend these days with her I see first hand where she is held amongst her peers from other schools and then how she can impart this knowledge to our own staff in our Professional Learning Communities at school. Such leadership builds capacity amongst all at Holy Rosary which in turn builds the capacity of our students to learn.

**STAFFING UPDATE**

On Friday we farewelled Dave Price as he heads back to his Summer job of GrainCorp manager. Thanks Dave for all that you have contributed to Holy Rosary. You will make a great teacher for sure.

Eamon heads off to placement at Kyneton Hospital for five weeks starting tomorrow. He will be back for week. Good luck Eamon. This week we welcome back Sophie after her placement. She is with us until the end of the year.
