The Australian Catholic community remained faithful to Mary and Australia was the first nation to choose her under the title, 'Mary Help of Christians' as principle Patroness.

The Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians is an opportunity for Australians to thank God for His blessings that we enjoy. The feast is also a prophetic call to all Australians to work against social trends that marginalise sections of our community.

HEAD LICE



We have reports of Head Lice in some classrooms. Many head lice do not cause an itch, so you have to look carefully to find them. We ask all parents to please check their children’s hair regularly, especially at change of seasons, and treat if necessary. Once hair has been treated, children can be returned to school. Anyone can get head lice and given the chance head lice move from head to head without discrimination (washed or unwashed hair, it does not matter). Children get head lice from direct hair to hair contact with another person who has head lice. This can happen when children play, cuddle or are working close together. They do not have wings or jumping legs so they cannot fly or jump from head to head. They can only crawl

Term 2: Vocabulary activities

5. Provide a word or concept, for example 'big'.


Children must generate two sets of words related to the target word or concept – synonyms or similarities and antonyms or opposites.

To prompt synonyms, ask children to think of words that mean the same thing as the target word, in this example: gigantic, huge, enormous, large ... would be synonyms

To prompt antonyms, ask children to think of words that have opposite meaning to the target word, in this example: small, tiny, minute, little ... would be antonyms

Tip: Discuss each word as it is generated. Encourage children to clearly describe how the two words (target word and proposed word) are similar or how they are opposite.

Show words in a venn diagram;





