### FROM THE PRINCIPAL, MR PAUL DULLARD

Dear Parents, Friends and Carers,

I would like to thank all parents who have engaged in a Parent Support Group (PSG) meeting for their child over the past weeks. These have been run via a phone call and from all reports they have been very successful. Of course the face to face element of such meetings is missing, but I am very glad that we have been able to continue to support our children who require some extra support. One element of what makes Holy Rosary a great school is that we support all children at the point of need that is individual to them.

Thank you to the staff who prepare the Personal Learning Plans (PLP's) for the children involved and take the time to set goals and acknowledge growth for the past semester. The teachers really do know the children well and understand their needs and strengths.

In the coming weeks, our staff intend to spend some of their learning time looking at how to better create goals to support every child. Having a goal each day, week, term is one way of our children being able to strive for success at the level they are at.

In our staff meeting this week, I commended our staff on how they are working so beautifully as a united team through this COVID-19 period. We talked about the importance of a Positive Mind Set and how this can affect those around us when we do adopt such a mind set. Too often we are faced with poor statistics or new challenges that can drag us down especially if we watch too much news, but how we react influences our family, friends and especially our children. As a team at Holy Rosary, we strive to provide a positive place for our children. A learning place that is calm but energetic, busy but ordered and fun but respectful.

### WELCOME

I would like to welcome Mrs Corrine Cummins to our staff as she joins our Senior team for Wednesday to Friday each week. Corrine is well known to Holy Rosary as one of our regular CRT's and has now come onto our team for the remainder of the year to support learning in the Senior classes. Corrine knows our students very well and they respond beautifully to her. For many years, Holy Rosary has had extra staff across the school. This year, we have seven full time teachers for the equivalent of five classes to ensure smaller classes and more focused small group work. Mrs Cummins will work across all children in the Senior rooms over her days, which is aimed at ensuring all children get to learn at their particular point of need. Welcome Corrine.

### FLYING START 2020

One of the great programs run at Holy Rosary each year is Flying Start, where kinder kids get to come to school and experience what it is like and to get to know the place. It is also a great way for them to learn the school ways and develop school language. Flying Start also presents great opportunities for parents to meet others with children of a similar age. Often these friendships last forever and parents feel so much more comfortable coming into school in the new year.

Of course COVID-19 has presented some additional challenges for Holy Rosary to host 'Flying Start' this year, but we are intent on making this school familiarisation program happen for the preschool children of Heathcote and district.

After much consultation with our governance body the Catholic Education Office Sandhurst (Bendigo) as to the guidelines and protocols around transition programs for Term 3 2020, it has been decided that the Holy Rosary Flying Start program will go ahead as normal, with tight COVID -19 protocols in place.

The dates and times for Term 3 '**Flying Start**' are as follows:

Due to COVID-19 we will be implementing the special instructions listed below:

- **Drop off and pick up will happen in the school car park**, where cars will enter the middle gate and park in the bays provided.
- Parents are welcome to walk their preschool child to the gathering space where the teachers will be. This will be away from the school drop off zone.
- Families who have both school age children and a Flying Start child will be required to drop off through the drive through then go out on the road and re-enter the car park for Flying Start.
- Staff will be in the car park to greet parents and kinder kids.
- Unfortunately schools are operating under a '**Non Essential Visitors**' restriction and that includes parents and guardians, so there will be no parents/guardians allowed past this point.
- Whoever is responsible for the dropping off and picking up of each preschool child will need to sign an attendance record sheet each time which will be at the drop off point.
- Holy Rosary has strong protocols in place around reinforcing good hygiene practices, ie. use of hand sanitizer and the 'Flying Start' children will follow these same protocols. Please indicate if your child has any allergies to sanitizer so that alternative arrangements can be made.
- 'Flying Start' children will not be mingling with Holy Rosary children and will learn for the two hours in the Arts Centre or under the COLA.

## **Semester 2 - Learning Conversations - Holy Rosary Heathcote**

This semester, our Learning Conversations will run a little differently to normal due to our social distancing guidelines. Each family will be given the opportunity to book a 15 minute block (*per child*) to discuss the progress of their child.

The Learning Conversations will be conducted via a **telephone call**. We ask that you conduct the interview in the presence of your child and have the telephone on **loud speaker** (if you have that facility) so that the child has the opportunity to be part of the conversation.

Our teachers will email a copy of the 'Learning Conversations' proforma prior to the conversation. We also send a hard copy (signed by the teacher) and ask that you return it to school **signed** with your signature.



## How much is too much?


There is no magic figure. The right amount of screen time can depend on a range of factors like your child's age and maturity, the kind of content they are consuming, their learning needs and your family routine.

It can be easy to focus only on the clock, but the quality and nature of what they are doing online, and your involvement, are just as important.

Consider your child's screen use in the context of their overall health and wellbeing. For example, is online time getting in the way of their sleep and exercise? Is it impacting on their face-to-face connections with family and friends?

The answers to these questions will guide you and help strike the right balance of online and offline activities for your child.





## WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE SENIOR UNIT

We have been very busy in the Senior Unit this week as we settle back into the routines of school. From all accounts, everyone has had a good holiday and come back to school refreshed and ready to learn.

We welcome Corrine Cummins, who will be planning with the Senior Unit on Tuesdays and will be teaching on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Corrine has an excellent understanding of our children and is an asset to our unit.

In the Senior Unit, teachers and students have been catching up on Literacy and Numeracy testing. This will give us a great understanding of the students' strengths, challenges and growth. As a unit, we will look at this data to identify the needs of each student which will inform our teaching groups for the next couple of weeks.

Just a reminder that we ask students to read at home for 20 minutes, 5 times a week to help consolidate and compliment the strategies that we explicitly teach at school. We encourage you to read with your child when possible and have regular discussions about what they are reading, their understanding and thoughts about the text.


There are many opportunities at home to develop your child's numeracy skills. Some examples of these opportunities are using money at the shop and calculating change, solving number problems, working with time, measuring ingredients when cooking and practising the times tables.

In RE, students have started a research project about The Church in Australia. They are creating a slideshow to present their findings about significant figures in the early Australian Catholic Church, such as Mary MacKillop and Caroline Chisholm.

## WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE JUNIOR UNIT

Welcome to Week Two of Term Three.

Only two weeks into our Literacy Groups for this term, and our Junior students continue to show positive signs of growth in terms of; their reading skills, development of strategies to aid their navigation of texts and their engagement in a range of activities that assist them to think more deeply about what they have read.

As Junior unit teachers, we are so thrilled to see every student contributing their very best efforts to become the most capable reader possible. Their enthusiasm, teamwork and input during our reading sessions are of a level they should each be very proud of.

Despite your child not bringing a specifically selected reader home each night they are still reading up to four times a week with a teacher, of which their progress is monitored and therefore helps us to determine their placement within a group that meets them at their immediate point of learning.

## **Season's for Growth**

*A grief and loss program*

Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage in our lives.

At Holy Rosary we recognise that when changes occur in families through death, separation, divorce or related circumstances, children and young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively.

We are therefore offering a very successful program called Seasons for Growth. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research that highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks.

Seasons for Growth runs for eight weeks and each weekly session is 40-50 minutes during school hours. The program concludes with a 'Celebration' session. Later in the year each group will have the opportunity to meet for a Reconnector sessions to build on their earlier learning and to follow up how each child is going.

Seasons for Growth will be facilitated by companion **Catherine Hodder** (Student & Family Wellbeing Worker) who has received special training in the use of this program and has been running this program in other schools for the last ten years.


### STUDENT ABSENCES NOTIFICATION

From the start of Term 3 2018, the Department of Education requires parents/guardians to notify the school of their child's absence **as soon as possible on the day of absence** by either using the **Skoolbag App** or phone the school.

All schools are required to contact parents on the same day of an unexplained student absence if they haven't heard from parents/guardians. The Skoolbag App is the preferred method as this sends us an email which can be kept as proof of contact.

### BUS TRAVELLERS

We ask all parents/carers to make sure their child/ren are clear about whether or not they are travelling on the afternoon bus. If you can make a point of letting your child/ren know the arrangement each morning it would be greatly appreciated. We often have students asking us if they are on the bus!

I spoke to the children on Monday who travel on the bus about how the bus driver's job is to drive them safely. Steve and Suze should not be distracted by poorly behaved children. Please speak to your child about the importance of their best behaviour. Please note that parents are required to be at the bus stop 15 minutes before the bus arrives in the morning and afternoon.

**If you do need to alter the arrangement please call the school before 2.30pm to allow time for the message to be passed on. Late calls may mean your child does not get the message in time before the bus leaves.**
