NEW FACILITIES COMPLETION AND PUPIL FREE DAY TO MOVE

Late last term I indicated that our new facilities would be completed by Wednesday 7th July (SECOND WEEK OF HOLIDAYS). This is now extended by two weeks but still within the contract timeline.

As advertised last week the date for us to move in will now be **Friday 30th July**. This allows us time to ensure that we are not dragging mud throughout the new facilities. We are very grateful that despite the most disrupted period of our lives, our building project has not been impacted greatly by shortages and that it is on time and on budget.

IMPORTANT: To allow us to move in to the new space and to ensure that all stakeholders learn how to use it properly and as it is planned for, we will be having a **PUPIL FREE** day on **Friday 30th July** when staff will be all hands on deck to move into the new spaces.

This is a great service for our school and at the same time creates funds for special purchases that support our students. They will be setting up a roster system and will inform all of the wonderful mums and carers who put their names down to help, what their role is once this is completed. I also commend our admin officers Donna and Tania for their behind the scenes work in ensuring the tuckshop gets up and running.

Our first Tuckshop will be on Friday 6 August - a menu and order form is contained in this newsletter, and hard copies will be handed out to the students.

SIGN IN - The foyer of the O'Dee is still our entry to the school.

In compliance with COVID19 restrictions, we have set up a **QR code** for Services Victoria. Any visitors (including parents) who enter the school's internal buildings are required to check in via the QR and must wear a mask. *Parents who come on site, **but do not enter a building**, do not require to sign in.*

Our existing sign in processes are still in place also. (Sign in book and COVID19 questionnaire).

MASKS/ASSEMBLY/VISITORS

Anyone over the age of 12 (If not enrolled at the school) must wear a face mask whenever they enter the school. Our teaching staff are not required to wear a mask while in class or on yard duty.

Unfortunately, we are unable to invite parents/families on site for gatherings (**including assemblies**). We request that parents not enter the school buildings if it is not essential. We hope that this can change and go back to normal next term. Thank you for your understanding.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

Focus: Comprehension (Asking for clarification)

Listeners are often very good at picking up signs of misunderstanding such as blank facial expression, or odd responses. However, sometimes in a busy household or classroom, these signs can be missed. The child could also be very good at covering difficulties up. If your child has difficulty understanding something, they need to ask for clarification. Teach them how to do this, model appropriate times to do this and reinforce the fact that it is ok to check.

Teach your child these sentences:

- I don't understand.
- I'm not sure what you mean. Can you please help?
- Can you please tell me that again?
- I just want to check that I understand. Did you mean...

FLYING START TRANSITION PROGRAM



Holy Rosary is offering Transition mornings for students moving into Foundation in 2022 and the opportunity for families to be welcomed into the school. The goal of this program is to help prepare students in their transition to school for 2022 through structured activities and experiences that will help support their social and academic development.
