This Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of Lent and in Sunday's Gospel (Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32) we are reminded of the story of the Prodigal Son. When we reflect on the Gospel many of us think that the son who spent his inheritance was greedy and wasteful and the son who remained with the Father was well within his right to be put out by the Father's great welcoming home of this 'waster'. It certainly stirs up many feelings of inequality for the 'good son', however, while we are side tracked and wrapped up in these feelings we are missing the real focus of the Gospel which is that of a loving, forgiving, merciful father. It could be seen that neither of the sons are worthy of their father's love. One turned his back on that love and the other expected it as a rightful due. How often in life are we guilty of coveting that of others instead of being grateful for our own blessings?

ORAL HEALTH SCREENING

Community Dental Services at Bendigo Health is sending a team to Holy Rosary Primary School Heathcote to conduct oral health screening for students on **April 24**th, **2017.**

The screening team is made up of fully a qualified Oral Health Therapist and Dental Assistant, who both work for Bendigo Health. All members of the team have 'Working with Children' checks. This service will be provided free of charge.

Why are they doing oral health screens?

They will be looking for any signs of tooth decay or gum disease.

Up to half of school-aged children can have tooth decay and gum disease. It can develop without any pain. If tooth decay and gum disease is detected early, children can avoid losing teeth.

Permission forms are attached as well as on the App for you to return to the office ASAP.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS






1. Building knowledge of rhyme takes time, Children usually find it easier to recognize rhyme (which words rhyme? Cat bat tree?) before they can produce rhyming words (tell me a word that rhymes with 'rough'?). When reading/singing rhyming books and songs, pause slightly before the second rhyming word. This helps your Child to think about and even guess what the rhyming word could be. For example, "wine...dine... they rhyme! They both have the same sounds at the end of the word (ine)."

Here are a few fabulous books that you might want to find/borrow to read with your child.

2. When learning to read and spell words, Children need to be able to blend individual sounds together to form new words. For example, t - 0 - p = top. You can support your Child to practice blending sounds together by separating sounds in words and asking them to say what the word is. Use words from their book.

Choose words from your child's reader and say the sounds of different words in slow motion like this /m/-/a/-/n/ or /f/-/l/-/a/-/g/. Get your child to guess the words. You can incorporate this into everyday conversation e.g. Can you please put this in the /b/-/i/-/n/?



Oral health screening at your school



Community Dental Services at Bendigo Health is sending a team to Heathcote holy Rosary Primary School to conduct oral health screening for students on **April 24**th, **2017.**

The screening team is made up of fully a qualified Oral Health Therapist and Dental Assistant, who both work for Bendigo Health. All members of the team have 'Working with Children' checks.

We will be providing this service free of charge.

Why are we doing oral health screens?

We will be looking for any signs of tooth decay or gum disease.

Up to half of school-aged children can have tooth decay and gum disease. It can develop without any pain. If tooth decay and gum disease is detected early, children can avoid losing teeth.

What will happen in the oral health screen?

During the screen visit, your child will sit in a chair, and the oral health clinician will look in their mouth with a sterile mouth mirror and light.

They will be looking for any signs of tooth decay or gum disease. It will take about 5 minutes. We hope it will be a bright and cheerful experience for all children.

Following the screen, we will post a brief report to the child's home address, telling parents and guardians what we have found. The report is completely confidential, and the details will be kept at Bendigo Health.

If further treatment is needed, it is available free of charge for eligible children, at Bendigo Health.

The oral health screening visit does not replace a full examination at a dental surgery, but it is a good way to check for any early signs of dental disease.

Fluoride treatment for teeth at risk

Fluoride varnish is used for teeth at risk of tooth decay. The varnish is applied using a brush and painted on to teeth of concern. The procedure takes approximately 2 minutes. If you do not wish for your child to receive this treatment please indicate on the allocated section of the consent form.
