FROM THE PRINCIPAL, MR PAUL DULLARD

Dear Parents, Friends and Carers,



Welcome back to Term 4 everyone and welcome back to onsite learning. It was fantastic to once again have all staff at the drive through to say hello to families as they came through to drop off their excited children. This is how it should be and we pray that our State of Victoria can move forward in a safe and positive manner to less restrictions...

We took the opportunity for this photo as it is a significant day as we return after the most disrupted year in history. I hope we never have to undergo the restrictions we have been through again.

I am extremely grateful to all parents for how they have been so supportive of their own children as well as our school over this period. These have been unchartered waters we have been crossing and every week presented us with a new set of guidelines or challenges. Your communication with the teachers and effort with your own children has been very much appreciated.

It was fantastic to see how the children stepped out of their cars with a big hello and a smile on Tuesday morning. I know the staff really love these moments in school life. Then to see the children renew their friendships with each other and to gather in small groups, with plenty of chatter.

I especially wish our Grade 6 students a great term as their big final year has been quite a different affair. They look great in their Grade 6 shirts and I think just about everyone of them has grown taller over COVID. Our senior teachers are out to ensure this final term is a memorable one for the big kids.



At the other end of the scale, our littlest children in school and those that have only been here a while have found it hard to have consistency with friendship groups and we will ensure this is a priority in this term.

As you are aware, our adult community is still not able to come onto the school property unless by appointment. This again reduces the risks of any COVID-19 implications, but on a social level it does not allow for all of us to continue or create friendship groups or connections with parents of their child's friends. Let's hope that these restrictions can be eased over the term and we can resume the great community feel at drop off and pick up each day.

As our students return to school after almost two terms of remote learning we are often unsure of where they are at as an individual with their learning. Therefore, this week we have planned for testing and assessment for all students in numeracy and literacy. The children are aware that this is not a competitive process but an exercise that is all about them and where they are at right now. Teachers will then analyse this data to determine the 'Point of Need' learning for each child. I commend the staff for taking this on and for Mr Ryan for coordinating it all in his role as Leader of Learning.

We have a major goal of ensuring that every child has success with their learning in Term 4. This means individual growth from where they are at right now to where they can aspire to be by the end of the year. Where your child is at right now is the starting point and we aim to see individual growth through small groups, co teaching and collaboration in every child.

Initial results from the testing have shown that most children have advanced their learning over Remote Learning which is a credit to them and to you as parents/ grandparents and their primary educators. Well done and we look forward to analysing the complete data next week and setting up learning plans for each child.

This week we welcome the **Manderson** family to our Holy Rosary community. **Archer** is in Foundation class and **Max** is in Grade 2. We welcome both boys and their parents **Zoe and Cam** to Holy Rosary. Due to COVID-19 restrictions we are unable to come into the school which makes it difficult for new families to meet others, but I am sure our families will look out for the new ones.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2021/FLYING START

We are currently receiving enquiries from parents in regards to Foundation children for 2021. Any families who require a pack from the office can email myself or ring Donna Neylon in the office. We can then arrange for pick up or postage of the pack. If you know of families new to Holy Rosary please pass this information onto them. We will be starting Flying Start in Week 2 this Term. ENTRANCE/EXIT POINTS INTO THE SCHOOL

As a further safety measure for families who walk or ride to school we have made the following change to our arrival and departure points of our school.

Any family who rides or walks to school and comes across the crossing can enter the school via the school bus gate. Parents are to drop their children at the gate where they will be met by a staff member but not enter the school. TESTING







This week, teachers and students have been very busy conducting testing of reading and numeracy. This will give teachers a baseline for each student and their individual point of need. From this, teachers can plan learning tasks and experiences designed to engage and grow the learning for all children.

So far, our teachers have been very impressed with the learning that has taken place this year. This is a testament to the hard work of families and our teachers.





LIFE RELATIONSHIPS

There is a requirement for all Victorian Schools to address particular aspects of personal development within their teaching. Our senior students have begun the *Life Relationships Program*, which has been developed in the Sandhurst Diocese and includes a unit of work for Year 5/6 students. The program offers an holistic approach within the context of Catholic teaching to topics such as:

- relationships
- family
- adolescence and puberty
- · reproduction.

The Life Relationships Program is an integral part of the Source of Life, Diocese of Sandhurst Religious Education Curriculum and the Physical, Personal and Social Learning Strand of the Victorian Essential Learning Standards.

The *Life Relationships* program seeks to strengthen the partnerships between parents/caregivers, students and school. One of the main aims of the program is to open or maintain lines of communication and hence foster healthy relationships.

Your child's teacher is available to answer any questions that you may have regarding the program. You might also like to ask to have a look at the resources which we will be using.

A grief and loss program

Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage in our lives.

At Holy Rosary we recognise that when changes occur in families through death, separation, divorce or related circumstances, children and young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively.

We are therefore offering a very successful program called Seasons for Growth. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research that highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks.

Seasons for Growth runs for eight weeks and each weekly session is 40-50 minutes during school hours. The program concludes with a 'Celebration' session. Later in the year each group will have the opportunity to meet for a Reconnector sessions to build on their earlier learning and to follow up how each child is going.

Seasons for Growth will be facilitated by companion **Catherine Hodder** (Student & Family Wellbeing Worker) who has received special training in the use of this program and has been running this program in other schools for the last ten years.

2020 'FLYING START' TRANSITION PROGRAM COVID-19 ADJUSTMENTS

Hi Everyone,

After much consultation with the Catholic Education Office Sandhurst (Bendigo) as to the guidelines and protocols around transition programs for Term 4 2020, it has been decided that the Holy Rosary Flying Start program will go ahead as normal, with tight COVID -19 protocols in place.

The dates and times for Term 4 'Flying Start' are as follows:

Friday 16 October	8.45am – 11:30am
Friday 30 October	8.45am – 11:30am
Friday 13 November	8.45am – 11:30am
Friday 27 November	8.45am – 11:30am

When attending 'Flying Start' could the children please:

- Dress like they would when they are attending preschool.
- Bring along a snack, ie. piece of fruit, and their own drink bottle.

Mrs Prue Harris and Mrs Angela Fiske-Keely, our current F/1 teachers will run 'Flying Start' with the occasional assistance of other Holy Rosary staff.

This program is open to any preschool child who is beginning school next year free of charge, but we do ask that your child is registered with the school prior to the start of the program by emailing the office at - <u>admin@hrheathcote.catholic.edu.au</u>

The program has been very popular for many years and with additional restrictions placed on schools currently due to COVID-19 it is essential that we have your booking by *Wednesday 14 October*.

COVID-19 has presented some additional challenges for Holy Rosary to host 'Flying Start' this year, but we are intent on making this school familiarisation program happen for the preschool children of Heathcote and district.

Due to COVID-19 we will be implementing the special instructions listed below:

- **Drop off and pick up will happen in the school car park**, where cars will enter the middle gate and park in the bays provided.
- Parents are welcome to walk their preschool child to the gathering space where the teachers will be. This will be away from the school drop off zone.
- Families who have both school age children and a Flying Start child will be required to drop their school children off through the drive through then go out on the road and re-enter the carpark for Flying Start.
- Staff will be in the car park to greet parents and kinder kids.
- Unfortunately schools are operating under a 'Non Essential Visitors' restriction and that includes parents and guardians, so there will be no parents/guardians allowed past this point.
- Whoever is responsible for the dropping off and picking up of each preschool child will need to sign an attendance record sheet each time which will be at the drop off point.
- Holy Rosary has strong protocols in place around reinforcing good hygiene practices, ie. use of hand sanitizer and the 'Flying Start' children will follow these same protocols.
- 'Flying Start' children will not be mingling with Holy Rosary children and will learn for the two hours in the Club House or under the COLA.

Please be aware that during these uncertain times, directives and guidelines provided to us by the CEO and relevant Ministers can change very quickly. If there is any alteration to the above we will ensure you are updated promptly.

CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND

CSEF will once again be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities. Further details are below. STUDENT ABSENCES NOTIFICATION


The Department of Education requires parents/guardians to notify the school of their child's absence **as soon as possible on the day of absence** by either using the **Skoolbag App** or <u>phone the school</u>.

All schools are required to contact parents on the same day of an unexplained student absence if they haven't heard from parents/guardians. The Skoolbag App is the preferred method as this sends us an email which can be kept as proof of contact.

Skoolbag is one of Australia's most trusted school apps, empowering schools to engage parents through a simple and central communication platform. The easy-to-use desktop and mobile app streamlines all aspects of organising school life, from newsletters and events to student attendance and documentation.





BUS TRAVELLERS

We ask all parents/carers to make sure their child/ren are clear about whether or not they are travelling on the afternoon bus. If you can make a point of letting your child/ren know the arrangement each morning it would be greatly appreciated. We often have students asking us if they are on the bus!

I spoke to the children on Monday who travel on the bus about how the bus driver's job is to drive them safely. Steve and Suze should not be distracted by poorly behaved children. Please speak to your child about the importance of their best behaviour. Please note that parents are required to be at the bus stop 15 minutes before the bus arrives in the morning and afternoon.

If you do need to alter the arrangement please call the school before 2.30pm to allow time for the message to be passed on. Late calls may mean your child does not get the message in time before the bus leaves.

One of the most important things we can do to slow the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) in our community is to stay at home when we are unwell, even when we have the mildest of symptoms.

What you need to know

If a child is unwell, even with the mildest of symptoms, they must stay at home

If a child becomes unwell during the day, they must be collected from school/early childhood education and care (ECEC) as soon as possible.

- If a child has any of the symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) outlined below, however mild, they should get tested and they must remain at home until they receive their results:
- fever
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath
- runny nose
- loss of sense of smell or taste.

In certain circumstances headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea may also be considered symptoms.

A child must stay at home until they are symptom free, even if their coronavirus (COVID-19) test is negative

If a person has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) they must isolate until they receive clearance from the Department of Health and Human Services. Read the <u>What to do if you've</u> tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) factsheet (PDF) for more information.

If a person is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) the Department of Health and Human Services will get in contact to tell them they are a close contact of a person who is confirmed to have coronavirus (COVID-19). A close contact must quarantine at home. Read the <u>What to do if you have been in</u> <u>close contact with someone with coronavirus</u> (COVID-19) factsheet (Word) for more information.

For information on the minimum periods students and children need to stay at home for other conditions, refer to the <u>DHHS school</u> <u>exclusion table</u>.

4. Children do NOT need a medical certificate before returning to school/ECEC

Once symptoms have cleared, there is no requirement from the Department of Education and Training or DHHS for children/students to have a medical certificate before they return to school/ECEC.

Thank you for your support in following these steps, together we can all stay safe.
