This week we commemorate National Sorry Day which marked the beginning of Reconciliation Week. We could all take to heart the message of John Paul II to the Aboriginal People on his visit to Alice Springs, when he said:-

"If you stay closely united, you are like a tree, standing in the middle of a bushfire sweeping through the timber. The leaves are scorched and the tough bark is scarred and burnt; but inside the tree the sap is still flowing, and under the ground the roots are still strong. Like that tree, you have endured the flames, and you still have the power to be reborn". (JPII)

Let us encourage one another to be as strong as that tree by promoting Reconciliation and Peace ... Let us pray for our Aboriginal brothers and sisters, asking God to bless our Indigenous races with new hope ...

We ask you to help us, the people of Australia, To listen to them and respect their culture. 

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS


Focus: Understanding instructions

Assist your child to understand instructions by using actual objects or gestures. Here are some ideas:

- Point to your shoes when you are asking your child to get their shoes,
- Gesture with your hands for concepts like under, first,
- Point in the direction of Grandma's house,
- Point to your watch if you are telling your child to hurry up.

In addition to this, teach your child to repeat instructions back to themselves to support comprehension. Model this self-talk yourself and prompt your child to do the same by asking, 'Now tell me, what do you have to do?'.

<u> AUSTRALIAN DENTAL HEALTH VIC - DENTAL VAN</u>

The Australian Dental Health VIC Dental Van is coming to Holy Rosary! The Dental Van will be at the school from **Monday 19 July - Wednesday 21 July.**


Australian Dental Health VIC ("ADHV") is an Independent Initiative providing all school students dental treatment beyond the Medicare eligibility criteria, meaning all students are able to participate.

ADHV is an independent, stand-alone company that can see both non-eligible children alongside those who are eligible. The organisation runs on its own accord to ensure all children across the board are receiving vital treatment.

Children will be seen in their school environment, allowing them to feel safe and comfortable. Australian Dental Health standards of oral health co-aligns with the Departments' curriculum to ensure children are properly educated. ADH does this by offering interactive oral health classes.

Consent Forms were sent home with all students on Wednesday. If your child did not receive a form, please let their teacher, or the office know. If you wish for your child/children to be seen by the Dentist, please ensure you return the completed consent form by **Friday 28 May 2021**.





Working together to support our communities

Recently, currently &/or shortly community members have, are and/or will be receiving the information booklet containing local Covid-19 vaccination information for them to refer to. There are electronic engagement spaces for us all to engage with as well, but these paper copy booklets will ensure everybody has the opportunity to have access to the most uptodate relevant and local information. These are being distributed by most of our wonderful local Post Office outlets in our smaller communities.

For us to provide help where needed, we would love to hear from anyone with a question/concern/barrier to receiving a vaccination. Be it about obtaining any information, answer or support & assistance they may have - ie; transportation to get to a vaccination appointment, need access to receiving vaccinations outside of work hours, a carer for someone with a mental illness and/or medical condition or has special needs that need to be taken into consideration for getting to and entering into a vaccination clinic/program/appointment.

With this information we can work with the vaccinators, health services and others as needed to provide the service, support, assistance, answer or information they may require.

We have already heard from a number of people about holding a possible Saturday clinic or one after 6pm so that people returning from work can attend.
